God answers Hannah's prayer. 1 Samuel 1:1–2:11:

Theme: The key themes of this Bible story from 1 Samuel 1:1–2:11 include Hannah's longing for a child, her fervent prayer to God for a son, the misunderstanding by the priest Eli, and God's faithfulness in answering Hannah's prayer by granting her a son, Samuel, whom she dedicated to serve God.

Please begin your learning with the prayer in the 'Heart' section, then with the work in the 'Head' section, followed by applying your knowledge in the 'Hands' section.

Our Father,
who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name;
thy kingdom come; thy will be done; on
earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our
daily bread. And forgive us our trespasses,
as we forgive those who trespass against
us. And lead us not into temptation; but
deliver us from evil.
Amen.
