Jonah disobeys God. Jonah 1:1—2:10:

Theme: The key themes of this Bible story from Jonah 1:1—2:10 include disobedience, repentance, and God's mercy, as Jonah disobeys God's command to go to Nineveh, faces consequences for his disobedience, repents while in the belly of a fish, and experiences God's mercy through being saved from drowning.

Please begin your learning with the prayer in the 'Heart' section, then with the work in the 'Head' section, followed by applying your knowledge in the 'Hands' section.

thy kingdom come; thy will be done; on
earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our
daily bread. And forgive us our trespasses,
as we forgive those who trespass against

4. What happened to Jonah after he was thrown into the sea, and how did he feel while inside the fish?
